General Korat Characteristics

Korats are sensitive, loving, loyal, and gentle. They have excellent social skills and interact nicely with children. They have a typical life span of about 15 years. Many happy memories are created with a Korat by your side. Their beautiful coats are bluish with the tips of the hairs a silver color. This quiet breed will thrive in an inside environment. Korats have a tendency to move softly and quietly and very much dislike loud, harsh or sudden noises. If they are to be a show cat, they need to be handled and exposed to a certain amount of noise while they are kittens. This is a steadfast and loving breed and they tend to have a life expectancy that is suitable for a family pet. Proper diet, exercise, grooming and veterinary attention will benefit you and your Korat.

A few words about adoption

Look for a pet adoption shelter or rescue center in your community. Use your community resources, such as your library, newspaper, and any online information to understand the reputation of the shelter before you go there. Ask questions at the center and of other people who may have used their services before. Find out as much as you can about the history of the pets you are considering. Know that some pets are up for adoption because they have been left behind due to divorce or families having to relocate. Not all pets in shelters or rescue centers come from abused or neglectful situations. Pet adoption or rescue is less expensive than purchasing from a cat breeder. For families who face economical challenges this option is worth considering. You have the satisfaction of providing a home for a deserving pet.

A few words about breeders

Perhaps you prefer a Korat that comes from a reputable breeder in order to raise your pet as a show cat or breed your pet to further the advancement of new Korats in your community. Breeders are very knowledgeable about the breed's overall health and characteristics. You can find cat breeders by looking in the newspaper, searching on the internet, or checking with the local vet. Make sure the breeder is associated with a national association such as the CFA (Cat Fanciers Association). Cat breeders can be very particular about the person wanting to purchase the cat. They may want to know what other animals are in the home or if there are any children living in the home. Many breeders may ask you to sign a contract stating that you will keep the cat as an indoor pet. Make sure the breeders facilities are clean and always ask to see the mother and father of the kitten you want to buy. The breeder should be able to provide a written health guarantee and all shot records.

Either option is viable based on your own knowledge, expectations, and personal conviction. The most important thing to remember when selecting your pet is to select the pet right for you. Pet ownership is a big responsibility. Select a pet that fits your lifestyle.

How To Choose Your New Korat Kitten

Choosing a cat can be a difficult decision because there are many different personalities and aesthetic qualities you may want to look for. Do you prefer to have the runt of the litter or the huskiest brute? You really only have one color option with a Korat. They are a solid bluish silver, and if someone tries to sell you on any other variety, that particular kitten is not a Korat. Sometimes you can make a decision based on the adorable facial expressions a kitten makes. Can you resist those sweet kitten eyes that pierce right through to clench hold of your heart? Pet adoptions or rescues are viable options for selecting your Korat. Of course, finding a good breeder is always a good option too. Make sure you look for the following signs of a healthy cat:

- Bright and clear eyes
- Clean ears that are free of parasites
- Healthy coat and skin conditions

Before You Bring Your Korat Home

It is important to kitten proof your home and be as prepared as possible to provide a safe and secure environment for your new friend. In an effort to prepare for the care of your new best friend you should create a checklist and learn about the special needs of your pet. Make sure that your floors are free of clutter. You will want to have a scratching post for your new kitten to sharpen its claws on. Otherwise, your new baby may use your couch as its scratching post.

Create a list of items that you need for your new pet. You will need the essentials to care for your pet such as, a good kitten food, a brush for grooming, toys for playtime, and a litter box with a good quality kitty litter in it. You will also want to have a selection of toys and training items. The reward system is great for teaching your pet important lessons. Some toys double as treat holders so that when playing games with your pet they have a fun way to get to their reward. Your kitten will soon discover what you want from him if you use a loving manner to convey your messages. Korats are eager to please and respond well to positive reinforcement. Korats are also guiet, sensitive animals and they will respond much better to positive reinforcement. Loud noises or scolding will only be counterproductive. The severest form of punishment you can use on a Korat is a "time out". If they do something wrong, put them in a room by themselves for 5 minutes, then quietly let them out again. Since they are such a social breed, this will be the most productive way of reinforcing what you do not want them to do.

It is really important to start your kitten with a good health regimen. Keep accurate health and immunization records throughout the life of your pet. This will make it much easier for you to maintain proper health standards for your animal. Be sure to introduce him early to his vet and his grooming process. These are good practices for new owners as well as the kittens. Of equal importance is a healthy diet for your pet. It is a good idea to follow your breeder or vet's guidelines for all of your pet's nutrition needs. Kitten food has different nutrients than adult or senior foods. Allergy sensitive animals require special dietary ingredients as well. Being prepared is the most important aspect of introducing your new family member to his or her new environment. Purchase books about your breed, ask questions of the breeder and your vet, and read about your pet online or at your community library. Pay attention to the details for true success and your new family member will make a quick and happy adjustment to his new home.

Your Korat Through the Years

Your Korat Kitten

Each stage of your pet's life will be characterized by special needs. Kittens' lives are full of learning experiences. Enjoy the time you spend with your kitten. Use feathers, strings, or balls to keep your kitten active and know that you can use these toys not only to play but also to train your pet. Kittens learn quickly and can develop bad habits if they are not properly stimulated. Conversely, they can learn good habits if trained lovingly and early on.

Healthy habits are established at this stage of life as well. Vaccinations, dietary standards, and proper grooming regimens are very important for kitten. Your Korat should have its own clean bowls for food and water. Sometimes it is helpful to place the bowls on a non-slip surface. There are many decorative bowls and placemats available to make your pets feeding time special for him. Take extra time to get your kitten used to regular grooming. Overall, cats are good at grooming themselves. Occasionally you may need to trim their nails or give them a bath, especially if they develop a skin problem or have fleas. Most cats will also enjoy the attention you give them with a soft brush. Korats have a short coat with no undercoat, so they tend to shed less than other breeds. There are also toothbrushes and toothpastes specifically for cats. Some types of toothpaste are even meat or fish flavored! When you introduce a new grooming device to your kitten it is important to remember to let the kitten become acquainted with the item before using it. Remember to put the item away when you are no longer using it or the kitten might mistake it for a toy.

Your Adult Korat

As your cat begins to age, his needs begin to change. Keep surprises to a minimum by, yep you guessed it, being prepared. Keep your cat active and healthy. Change out his toys often to keep his interest. Sometimes adult cats develop allergies. If you notice changes in the skin, or fur you may need to change their diet. If your pet develops allergies you will see changes in his coat, skin, eyes or ears. If you suspect your cat has allergies, the best thing to do is take your cat to the vet. There are excellent remedies that will become an important part of your cat's routine.

As your cat ages his nails, paw pads, coat, skin, eyes and ears need special attention. Make grooming a happy time for your cat. You should keep the coat clean and free of dander, fleas, and tangled or matted hair. Also keep nails trimmed, check the pads on their paws frequently for spurs, and keep tooth tartar under control. Keep up with all of your adult pet's needs by frequently checking supplies and making sure that you have the most efficient tools handy to keep your cat in good health.

Your Senior Korat

When your pet climbs the hill into his senior years his needs will change again. Dietary changes are the most prevalent at this life stage.

Korats are not particularly prone to any specific illnesses or diseases. They are generally a trouble free breed, and very healthy overall.
